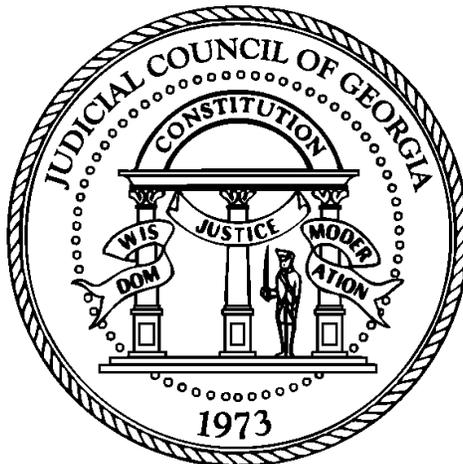



Call to Order

Chief Justice Sears convened the meeting at 9: 05 a.m. She welcomed all those present, especially Judge Henry Newkirk, State Court of Fulton County, who is sitting in for Judge Cole. She expressed appreciation to the State and Magistrate Court Judges Councils for hosting the Monday evening reception for Council members. The Chief Justice asked that members of the Council introduce themselves followed by those seated in the audience.

Approval of Minutes

Chief Justice Sears directed attention to the Minutes of the August 29, Judicial Council meeting. She reviewed additions on page 10 detailing the Council of State Court Judges plans for hosting the 2009 National Mock Trial event for high school students and projected start-up of a DUI court for the Henry County State Court. Hearing no other corrections or additions she asked for a motion to approve the minutes as revised. Judge Studdard moved approval. Judge Bobbitt seconded. The motion carried.

Approval of ICJE Curricula for 2007

Mr. Reaves reviewed the ICJE training courses to be offered in 2007 for magistrate court judges and municipal court judges. These proposed schedules for the second half of 2007 require Judicial Council approval. The magistrate court training schedule offers a total of 240 hours of courses available to fulfill training requirements

for basic certification of new judges, non-lawyer judges and re-certification. Slots for 605 attendees are available for the 515 magistrates in the state.

Similarly the municipal court opportunities for training include basic certification courses offered twice yearly. Mr. Reaves noted that 12 hours annual training is required for these judges. The ICJE provides training courses for municipal court clerks as well.

Judge Studdard asked whether ICJE will sponsor another Judicial Leadership Academy as in 2006. Mr. Reaves stated that the Leadership Academy, a biennial event, will be offered again in 2008.

Judge Baldwin moved approval of the schedules as presented. Judge Ott seconded. The motion carried.

Reports of Judicial Council Committees

County and Municipal Probation Advisory Council. Written report provided in agenda materials.

Georgia Courts Automation Commission. Written report in agenda.

Justice for Children Committee. Ms. Barclay, director of the project, reported for Justice Hines. She noted that the committee, formerly known as the Child Placement Program, has adopted a new name to better reflect its goals and activities. The program has been funded by Congress through 2011. She stated that details of efforts in the areas of automation of deprivation case records, court performance measures, etc. can be found on the web at www.georgiajusticeforchildren.org.

Records Retention Committee. Judge Whittemore stated that the committee has completed its final revision of the proposed evidence retention rule. The rule has been sent to each of the judges councils for their consideration. If needed, each council will

draft any additional or special requirements needed. Judge Whittemore stated that the target date for completion of this process is Labor Day 2007. At that time the rules must be submitted to State Bar for comment, before the Supreme Court can adopt them.

Standing Committee on Policy. Ms. Nesbit introduced Ms. Kelly Moody who will assist her during the session, replacing Tonya Greisbach. She reported that the committee reviewed two issues of concern: 1) Justice Hines committee has proposed legislation providing for judicial review in certain child custody cases; and 2) some modifications to correct unintended consequences to the new paternity and legitimation statutes passed in 2005 are being drafted by a Task Force chaired by Judge Jim McDonald. She stated that these revisions will be considered by the Standing Committee. Judicial Election Reform is already under discussion; Rep. Ed Lindsey will sponsor a measure that would provide for a public funding option.

Standing Committee on Drug Courts. Written report provided. Ms. Nesbit announced that the 2007 Drug Court Conference will take place May 30 – June 1 at the Wyndham Peachtree Conference Center.

Workload Assessment Committee. Dr. Arnold presented a summarized report on data compiled for the Workload Assessment Study. The report has two sections: pages 1-3 show courtroom work; page 4 shows work “out-of-court.” The data for criminal, civil and domestic relations cases is displayed by case-type and activity. Data on page 4 is categorized as either case-related or non-case-related activity. Dr. Arnold noted that a significant amount of the non-case related time reflects travel time for superior court judges in multi-county circuits. He expressed appreciation to all judges who kept detailed

records to make the study possible. More complete data analysis will be available at the June 2007 Judicial Council meeting.

Legislative Update

Ms. Nesbit reported that the General Assembly begins a new two-year term on January 8, 2007. She asked that judges consult the legislative website for daily information on actions in the House and Senate, committee meetings etc.

AOC Director's Report

Mr. Ratley began by introducing the current AOC management team: Deputy Director, Ms. Debra Nesbit; Assoc. Director for Administration, Mr. Vince Harris; General Counsel & Assoc. Director for Regulatory Affairs, Ms. Cynthia Clanton; Assoc. Director for Planning and Research, Mr. Bob Bray; Assoc. Director for Court Services, Mr. Chris Patterson.

He also recognized staff members who have recently assumed new positions: Ms. Stephanie Chambliss is now Asst. Director for Regulatory Affairs; Mr. Kevin Tolmich has moved from the Budget Office to Asst. Director for Planning; Ms. Yolanda Lewis, formerly Sr. Research Associate is now the Asst. Director for Judicial Liaison; Mr. Mark Seymour is now serving as Budget Officer. Mr. Ratley also recognized the able contributions made by Ms. Jane Martin, Asst. Director for Governmental Affairs, to the ongoing work of the AOC.

A "Georgia Court System Poster" created and produced by Ms. Ashley Stollar, AOC graphic designer was presented to the Council. The colorful poster supplies information on the courts formatted to appeal to middle school students studying the three branches of government. Mr. Ratley noted the poster, now in its second printing,

has been a hit with judges, students and middle school social science teachers throughout the state. He commended Ms. Bolton and the Communications Dept. for their good work.

Mr. Ratley referred to a letter included in the agenda regarding formation of a Supreme Court planning committee to consider the impact of a possible avian flu pandemic on the court system. Chief Justice Sears has already named Justice Harold Melton as chair of the new committee; members will be named early in the New Year. He noted that the CDC believes a flu outbreak could disrupt the lives of 3,000,000 Georgians.

In closing Mr. Ratley presented automated “dashboard” reports measuring the activities of AOC IT and AOC Fiscal.

Budget Matters

Judge Carriere stated that the budget numbers provided had not changed since the August meeting, however, the title of the budget document is now the Budget of the Judiciary (not the Judicial Branch budget). The total budget for judicial functions only is \$109,000,000; funds requested for Public Defenders and prosecutors are now included as an attachment. The difference is roughly \$100,000,000. We are now making a distinction between spending for judicial functions and spending for prosecutorial and defense functions.

A discussion followed regarding the budget problems of the Public Defenders Standards Council and the possible impact on 2008 appropriations. Funds needed for the Capital Defender’s portion of the Public Defense budget is also an issue. Funding for the statewide public defenders program was originally tied to revenue to be generated by

special fees; however, expenses for the full fiscal year will exceed those amounts. The Legislature has to wrestle with this reality and come up with a plan.

Reports from Appellate Courts and Judges Councils

Supreme Court. Chief Justice Sears congratulated all judges who won elections, especially Presiding Justice Hunstein.

Court of Appeals. Judge Ruffin reported that the Court's centennial celebration was a great success. Over 900 people attended the banquet held at the Georgia Aquarium. The court sponsored an oratorical contest with cash prizes funded by Justice Served, Inc. The winner, a young man from Cartersville, received \$7500 toward his college fund. He expressed appreciation to Mr. Jim Miller of Bell South who co-chairs Justice Served, Inc. with Judge Marion Pope; and also to Judge Yvette Miller who provided the theme for the oratorical competition. The court also had valuable assistance in preparing for the Centennial events from the AOC staffers, Ms. C. Clanton, Ms. Debra Nesbit, Ms. Jane Martin and Ms. Ashley Stollar.

The three Court of Appeals judges who have been temporarily housed off-site will move into newly-renovated space in the Judicial Building early in the New Year. The Office of the Clerk of the Court of Appeals has already opened in the Health Bldg.

In closing Chief Judge Ruffin recognized Chief Judge-elect Anne Barnes who will be sworn in January 4, 2007.

Council of Superior Court Judges. Judge Boyett stated that their council is a sponsor of the upcoming Media and Judiciary Conference to be held January 27, at the JW Marriott in Buckhead. Their Court Security Committee and the Georgia Sheriff's Association have jointly published voluntary courthouse security guidelines. The

guidelines represent minimum security standards and will be distributed to judges and legislators. Judge Billy Ray of Gwinnett County is spearheading their efforts at the General Assembly. They will be working especially on compensation issues.

Council of State Court Judges. Judge Studdard stated that it has been a pleasure to serve with judges of other courts and the Chief Justice on the Judicial Council. He values the relationships formed through attending Council meetings, briefings, etc. and emphasized his belief that relationships among judges are of singular importance. He pointed out that by developing individual relationships outside the judicial branch, with local representatives, or officials in the executive branch, we contribute to a stronger court system. Judge Studdard noted that such friendships require maintenance. Rather than making excuses that we have not been consulted on policy matters that affect the judiciary, judges must be good communicators about how the actions of the legislature may affect the courts.

He went on to say he has learned a great deal from working with other judges. He noted that in our state, many outstanding people carry out their duties creatively in the areas of drug courts, DUI courts, technology, and life. Our communities need to know this and hear about their judges concerns. He recognized the work of Ms. Billie Bolton of the AOC in the area of public outreach and public relations; development of the court system poster is only one example of successfully reaching out.

In closing Judge Studdard asked the Council members to enter into the coming year focused on what our councils can do to improve relationships with other councils and how we can make our legislators, children and public aware of what we as judges do and why it matters.

Council of Juvenile Court Judges. Judge Andrews stated that he endorses Judge Studdard's remarks regarding cooperative relationships. He, too, has learned a great deal serving on the Judicial Council. As to legislative matters, the juvenile court judges would like to see a revision to the qualifications for associate judges found in the statutes. The current statute does not state explicitly that Assoc. Judges of the juvenile courts are to be members of the State Bar. He believes the state salary supplement for juvenile court judges has helped the counties greatly and should be continued. The supplement has also propelled our juvenile courts in the direction of a more stable and coherent presence. As to pay raises they endorse "no judge left behind." Juvenile court judges will be present everyday of the session to answer questions, etc.

Council of Probate Court Judges. Judge Cason stated that the probate judges council recently held a planning meeting in Milledgeville at Central State Hospital. They chose this location to emphasize their growing concerns on mental health issues. The probate courts have no services to offer the mentally ill; they see a real need for improvement in this area. She expressed appreciation to Jorge Basto of the AOC for making on-line meetings possible and to Dr. Arnold for his work with council committees. She stated that it had been a pleasure serving on the Council and getting to know people.

Council of Magistrate Court Judges. Judge Bobbitt reported that their Retirement Board is now meeting each month; one-half of eligible judges have enrolled in the new system. Activity as the legislature involves clean-up issues re post-judgment discovery. They will hold a special "boot camp" training for new magistrate judges (appointed and elected) in Athens later in December. He introduced Ms. Sharon Reiss who became

executive director of the Council of Magistrate Court Judges on October 1. Ms. Reiss was formerly with the Board of Court Reporting.

Council of Municipal Court Judges: Judge Cilenski reported that training for municipal clerks is a new undertaking. He noted that Dr. Arnold has assisted the council with goal-setting, a business plan, court rules and accurate caseload reports.

Old/New Business

Chief Justice Sears announced the next meeting of the Judicial Council will take place on Tuesday, June 12, 2007 at the Jekyll Island Club.

She presented certificates of appreciation to those judges whose service as council members is ending: Chief Judge John Ruffin, Judge Stephen A. Andrews, Judge William T. Boyett, Judge Betty Cason, and Judge Ben Studdard.

Hearing no other business; Chief Justice Sears adjourned the meeting.

The Board of Court Reporting of the Judicial Council of Georgia is composed of nine members: five certified court reporters, two representatives from the State Bar of Georgia, and two members of the judiciary (one Superior Court judge and one State Court judge). The Board seats for three certified court reporters, one representative from the State Bar of Georgia, and the state court judge are currently open. According to O.C.G.A. § 15-14-24, the Judicial Council of Georgia appoints the members of the Board of Court Reporting for two year terms. Persons appointed to the Board must possess at least five years of experience in their respective professions of court reporting or law. The individuals being considered by the Judicial Council Nominating Committee are as follows:

STATE COURT JUDGE

1. **Judge Linda S. Cowen (Incumbent on the Board)** State Court Judge in Clayton County. The Honorable Linda S. Cowen has served as a judge in the State Court of Clayton County since 1995. Judge Cowen is the Past President of the Clayton County Bar Association and is a member of the Council of State Court Judges. Judge Cowen has served on the Board of Court Reporting for one term, is currently the chair, and requests reappointment to the Board of Court Reporting.

CERTIFIED COURT REPORTERS

2. **G. William (Bill) Abel, Jr. (Incumbent on the Board)** Official Reporter for Chief Judge C. Andrew Fuller of the Northeastern Judicial Circuit. Mr. Abel is a 1999 graduate of Brown College of Court Reporting. Mr. Abel has served as the president of the Georgia Shorthand

Reporters Association and is a member of the National Court Reporters Association. Mr. Abel is completing one term on the Board of Court Reporting and requests reappointment.

3. **Christopher Artman**, Freelance Reporter with Donovan Reporting. Mr. Artman studied at the Brown College of Court Reporting and has been a certified court reporter in Georgia since 2002. Mr. Artman has served as an official court reporter in the Superior and State Courts of Cobb County and has reported for the United States Bankruptcy Court of the Northern District of Georgia.

4. **Forrest Brown**, Freelance Reporter and founder of Brown College of Court Reporting. Mr. Brown has been a member of the court reporting profession for over fifty years. He served on various committees of the National Court Reporters Association and was president of both the Georgia Shorthand Reporters Association and the Baron Users Group. 5. **Daniel Gershwin**, Freelance Reporter and owner of D'Amico Gershwin, Inc. Mr. Gershwin has been a freelance reporter since 1985 and has served on the Board of the Georgia Shorthand Reporters Association. Mr. Gershwin earned his court reporting degree from Brown College of Court Reporting.

6. **Kerry McFadden (Incumbent on the Board)**, Freelance Reporter and owner of Professional Court Reporters, LLC. Ms. McFadden began her career in court reporting over ten years ago. She has taught speed and theory at Brown College of Court Reporting. Ms. McFadden attended the Reporting Academy of Virginia and has a B.S. in Mathematics Education from the University of Florida. Ms. McFadden is completing one term on the Board of Court Reporting and requests reappointment.

7. **John R. Price**, Freelance Reporter and the Official Reporter in the Effingham State Court. Mr. Price has served in the capacity of an official reporter for the superior and state courts of coastal Georgia for over thirty five years. He also was an official reporter for the Georgia Public Service Commission for a period of time. Mr. Price worked as Chief Legal Clerk and the court reporter for the State Judge Advocate of the Georgia Army National Guard while on active military duty. Re: Summary Report of the Superior Court Workload Study

1. Data was collected from April 17 to August 23, 2006. XX judges from across the state recorded 623,728 minutes of time in court, completing judicial and non-judicial work in chambers. The XX counties in the study statistically represented the state as a whole.
2. The recorded data was accurate as possible with less than 125 observations discarded due to incomplete data elements.
3. Data was presented to the JCWAC on March 2 and May 4, 2007.
4. The actions of the Committee are presented in summary on the following 12 pages.

Pages:

1. **Average Time to Disposition:** Using statistical methods, the raw data collected during the observation period was transformed into a yearly value.
2. **Judge Year Value:** Pages 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 show the varying judge year based on stratification. The different amounts of time allocated to performing work on the bench and in chambers are accounted for as is non-case related work. Each stratification chart includes a listing of circuits as categorized by the Committee.
3. **Value to Qualify:** The values to qualify, by circuit, without the threshold for the “Lo” and “Hi” options are shown on pages 7 and 8. The differences between the “Lo” and “Hi” with the weights used in the August 2006 assessment procedures before the Judicial Council are shown in the right hand column.

4. **“Lo” Option Judgeship Table:** On pages 9 and 10 the “JYear Value” column, shows the judgeship calculations needed based on the “Lo” option. The “Lo” option is the result of the ratio of the serious felony and felony cases counted, as of May 16, 2007, for CY 2006.

5. **“Hi” Option Judgeship Table:** On pages 11 and 12 the “JYear Value” column shows the judgeship calculations needed based on the “Hi” option. The “Hi” option is the result of the ratio of the serious felony and felony cases observed during the study.

It is uncertain which value will prevail in the end. It will probably be a lot like other such procedures and fall somewhere between the “Lo” and “Hi” values. It should be noted that only one of the metro counties has been counted and entered into the case count database and it has not been verified. It is not unreasonable to expect that the ratio between serious felony and felony will be higher in the larger courts not hearing misdemeanor cases.

Minutes:

Dr. Gregory Arnold opened the meeting with a short review of the sections to be discussed in the meeting (i.e. Criminal, General Civil, Domestic Relations, Case Related, Non-Case Related, and Travel Time). The presentation began with a review of the Criminal data section as presented in the participant notebook. Committee members were asked if the Misdemeanor and Serious Misdemeanor categories be collapsed while the Felony and Serious Felony categories remain separated. Judge Joe Bishop responded by suggesting that the Serious Misdemeanor and Misdemeanor categories be condensed while the Serious Felony and Felony categories remaining separated. No objections were noted by the Committee members.

The presentation continued with the General Civil data section as it was presented in the participant notebook. A discussion began around the ambiguity in utilizing the Case Type Unknown and the Other Civil category. Dr. Arnold further explained the differences on the 39.9 Case Type List in comparison to the SSCIS Case Type List. He also described the potential issues that can arise when attempting to condense both groups. Judge Bishop interjected by stating that although the Committee could identify the potential issues, it could not address them single-handed. No objections were noted by the Committee members.

The Domestic Relations data section as reviewed as presented in the participant notebook. Several Committee members went on to discuss the predicament of separating and re-categorizing case types such as divorce/alimony and support/custody case types.

Dr. Arnold discussed the Current Case Weights and the Calculation of Judge Year Value as described in the National Center for State Courts 2000 Study. He also emphasized the quandary of single county circuits receiving credit for travel. Next, Dr. Arnold reviewed the County Survey for Superior Courts list. After reviewing population differences on the Population by District, Circuit, and County sheet; the Committee made several changes to the original classification of counties and/or districts by stratification.

Dr. Arnold consented to send this information to the Chief Judge of each circuit requesting a judgeship, along with the Executive Committee and the District Court Administrators. The Committee agreed that if others wanted this information, they could request it directly from the District Court Administrator.

Fiscal Year 2007 Grant Process

The General Assembly appropriated \$1 million in continuation money to Drug Courts in Fiscal Year 2007. The Standing Committee appointed a Grant Review Committee to oversee the grant process. A total of 41 grants were awarded.

FY 2008 Grant Process

The General Assembly appropriated \$1 million in continuation money to Drug Courts in Fiscal Year 2008. A \$750,000 enhancement for Drug Courts and a \$400,000 enhancement for DUI Courts were appropriated by the General Assembly as well.

The Judicial Council Standing Committee on Drug Courts appointed a Statewide Funding Standards Subcommittee to review and oversee the grant process. Friday, May 4, 2007 was the deadline for receipt of all applications under the 2008 Drug Court Grant process. A total of 47 applications were received. Of this number 8 were implementation applications and 39 were requests for operational funds.

2007 Drug and DUI Court Conference

The Judicial Council Standing Committee on Drug Courts appointed a Drug Court Conference Subcommittee to oversee the planning of the 2007 Drug and DUI Court Conference. The Conference is scheduled for May 30 – June 1, 2007 at the Wyndham Peachtree Conference Center, with expected attendance of over 350 people.

Sustainability

Under House Bill 254, Drug Courts are allowed to earn and collect program income to provide a sustainable source of revenue for program operations. In order to be eligible for grant funding, the Judicial Council Standing Committee on Drug Courts requires comprehensive training for all drug courts, leading to the implementation of a long-term sustainability plan.

In the interest of sustainability, Judge George Kreeger, Judge Jack Partain, and staff recently visited the Marshall County Drug Court Program in Alabama to observe the Dade Behring drug testing and data collection system. The Judges reported they were favorably impressed by the Dade Behring system, which will allow participating courts to charge a fee for drug testing on non Drug and DUI Court participants. The Committee voted to move forward with pursuing a Statewide contract with Dade Behring for drug testing and data collection. The Committee also voted to have seven pilot sites for Dade Behring, which encompasses all types of Drug and DUI Courts.

A Pilot contract with Dade-Behring was signed on February 1, 2007 and will be effective through June 30, 2007. The contract will then be renegotiated as a Statewide contract with lower pricing.

The seven pilot sites are: Cobb, Hall, Conasauga, Tallapoosa, Athens, Gwinnett, and Glynn/Camden. Implementation of the Pilot sites took place in March and April, in which Dade-Behring provided offsite training at their expense to the courts.

Currently, Georgia has 50 Drug Courts with several more in the planning stages. The Judicial Council Standing Committee on Drug Courts encourages and supports the implementation of drug courts in all 49 Judicial Circuits.

**Supreme Court of Georgia's Commission Children, Marriage and Family Law
Committee on Justice for Children
Judicial Council Report, June 2007**

On October 4, 2006, The Supreme Court of Georgia renamed the Child Placement Project to the Committee on Justice for Children. This name works in conjunction with the new Supreme Court Commission on Children, Marriage and Family Law which includes the Committee on Justice for Children (J4C). The Committee on J4C was refunded to continue its work by Congress for additional five more years beginning in October 2006. For the last 10 years, the mission of this work has remained constant which is to improve the court process of child deprivation cases.

Justice P. Harris Hines serves as the current chair of the Committee on J4C. Committee members representing the judiciary, the state bar; the Department of Family and Children Services as well as the community include: Ms. Isabel Blanco, Deputy Director of the Division of Family and Children Services; Mr. Duaine Hathaway, Executive Director of Georgia CASA; Judge Michael Key, Troup County Juvenile Court; Dr. Normer Adams, Executive Director of the Georgia Association of Homes and Services for Children; Attorney Kathleen Dumitrescu, Atlanta Volunteer Lawyer Foundation; Judge Peggy Walker, Douglas County Juvenile Court; Judge Jackson Harris, Superior Court Judge, Blue Ridge Judicial Circuit; Senior Juvenile Court Judge James Morris; Judge Desiree Peagler, DeKalb County Juvenile Court; Attorney Robert Grayson, Cobb County, Special Assistant Attorney General; Judge Lawton Stephens, Western Judicial Circuit; W. Terrence Walsh, Alston & Bird, Chair of the State Bar Committee Children and the Courts; Ms. Lisa Lariscy, Gwinnett County DFCS Director; Judge Tom Rawlings, Juvenile Court of the Middle Circuit and Attorney DeAlvah Simms, Office of the Child Advocate. An extensive list of Committee advisors has also been formed and is listed on the website below.

Georgia has over 13,000 children in state custody due to child abuse or neglect. Priority goals for 2007 include: expediting appeals of termination of parental rights cases, strengthening court oversight of placement stability of children in foster care, improving the quality of representation of children, parents and the agency, defining for implementation court performance measures in deprivation cases and exploring the judiciary's role in prevention of unnecessary removal of children from their homes.

Improvement goals for the past nine years have included: automation of the deprivation case records, cross-training and setting standards of practice for all participants in juvenile court, increasing the representation of parents and children in juvenile court, and obtaining state funding for juvenile court judges. Benchmarks for some of these goals have been reached and while others have needed refinement.

Over the years, J4C grant funds have been used to: upgrade computers for juvenile court around the state; create an automated on-line case plan pilot; and create trial manuals and aspirational guidelines, and host conferences and workshops for participants in child deprivation cases. The J4C has a web site hosted by the AOC with regular progress reports and publications as well as a list serve open to all interested.

Administrative Activity

Budget Planning

A significant amount of time and effort was required from the Chair and Director during January, February and March to prepare for and attend multiple, often back-to-back meetings with House and Senate Appropriations Subcommittees. These committees requested significant amounts of information to support the FY07 Supplemental and FY08 budget requests of the commission. Preparation and testimony required huge blocks of time during this three month period to adequately address questions presented by the Representatives and Senators serving on these subcommittees.

The Commission revised its Strategic Business Plan since the last report to the Council insuring that the document remains accurate and current in its use as the guide for all Commission activities. A copy of this document is available on the web site at <http://www.gcacommission.org>

Newsletter

The Commission's newsletter, launched in late August 2006 to provide brief, concise, non-technical information relative to its projects and initiatives, will be published next during the month June 2007. Some of the information presented in this next issue will address the successes of the *Next Steps* of the Business Plan established to insure completion of the Data Definitions for the six individual classes of courts. Additional information will provide an update and status report on the development of the Common Data Dictionary to be used in the upcoming Data Exchange project and the continued support of the work of the individual Councils of Judges by the Commission through its attendance at their planned meetings and direct contributions to their planned initiatives.

Recap of December 2006 Report to Judicial Council

The December report welcomed Forsyth County State Court Judge T. Russell McClelland, III as its new member representative for the State Courts; said goodbye to Walker County State Court Judge C. Donald (Donnie) Peppers who completed four years of service on the Commission; recapped the August 2006 presentation to the Judicial Council on how the Commission operates using its **Vision, Mission and Guiding Principles** as the "drivers" for its work and a **Strategic Business Plan** with defined objectives and established time tables to achieve measurable results of its work; informed the Council about the \$74,330 short in total FY07 funding needed to continue operating at a level concurrent with the past two years; and informed the Council of the status regarding **Judiciary-wide Strategic Technology Planning, Judges Councils Strategic Planning Implementation, Data Exchange, Court Software Certification, and Historical Document Preservation.**



Budget

The GCAC FY07 Operating Budget of \$326,347 fell short by some \$74,330 of the total funds needed to continue operating at a level concurrent with the past two years and fully support the salary of the single staff member. This shortage in funds negatively affected the Commission's ability to fulfill its objectives planned for the Software Certification project for fiscal year FY07. Supplemental funding was requested from the General Assembly to help the Commission continue this work during FY 2007. An appropriation of \$18,583 or the equivalent of one calendar quarter funding was provided by the Legislature. This appropriation was used to pay FY07 expenses related to this project.

The GCAC requested \$780,000 in state appropriations from the Georgia General Assembly to fund its FY08 initiatives. The requested funds included continuation of the FY07 appropriations plus \$74,330 to fully fund the software certification project, \$27,867 to complete the full funding of the salary of the Commission's Executive Director and \$343,821 to fund the establishment of standards for the exchange of information among Georgia's five classes of trial courts. After much activity on the part of the Appropriations Committee's of both Houses and votes by the General Assembly, the Commission should receive an approximate increase of \$327,000 to fund FY08 initiatives.

Strategic Business Plan Initiatives



All six Councils of Judges are in motion and moving in the same direction. Fiscal year 2007 will finish with Technology Planning well established for every Council and on its way to becoming fully used by each Council. GCAC has as one of its priorities the task of keeping the individual Technology Plans in use and on a fast track.

The Data Definitions for all six Councils will have been completed as well and in use by an array of local counties and courts, state agencies and vendors in an assortment of various data sharing and exchange projects.

The common, standard Data Dictionary will have been established and the FY08 stage set to open with the Standards and Architecture project already under way. The Next Steps of the Commission's Strategic Plan define the appropriate direction for accomplishing the established, planned objectives and initiatives for FY08.

Utilization of its Strategic Business Plans continues as a primary objective of the Commission. The plan was updated during a work session at its March 2007 meeting. The purpose of the update was to recognize completed initiatives and to include and prioritize the next set of future initiatives. The progress within each of the key initiatives under their respective strategic objectives is shown in green in the chart above. This progress indicates some outstanding overall coverage by the Commission and participation by the Councils.



Judges Councils Strategic Planning Implementation

The Commission is currently actively assisting the Council of Municipal Court Judges in managing the implementation of their IT Strategic Initiatives. This work has included the development, issuance and reply compilation of a statewide IT survey. This survey resulted in a response rate of 50+ %.

The work completed during this period included:

- Facilitated GCAC Business Strategic Planning meeting.
- Documenting GCAC Business Strategic Plan updates.
- Conducted Implementation planning meeting in Macon and conference call with Municipal Courts.
- Participated in meetings with Forsyth and PAC regarding Data Definitions and Process Flow usage.
- Created implementation plan for conducting consolidation sessions with remaining courts – State, Superior, Juvenile and Probate.
- Conducted State Court Data Definition consolidation for Common Data Dictionary and documented results.
- Support with planning and budget documentation needs for the 2007 Legislative session.
- Reassigned 288 hours of planned consulting time from Council IT Planning Implementation to Data Definition consolidation effort for the creation of a Common Data Dictionary (attached).
- Arranged date extensions on Judiciary-wide IT Strategic Plan, Software Certification Program Assessment and Data Definitions Consolidation to accommodate a slow down in the scheduled work plan.

Judiciary-wide Strategic Technology Planning

The Development of an Information Technology Strategic Plan for the Judiciary of Georgia is on the calendar for late summer / fall of 2007. Facilitated sessions for the development phase of this initiative will be attended by designees from the six Council's and Council stakeholder groups. Identification and selection of key participants is under way. Achieving consensus on strategic direction for Information Technology of the Georgia Judiciary is essential to the success of this effort.

Court Data Definitions

Enabling Data Sharing and Supporting Standards

The Georgia Courts Automation Commission continues to invest in the Data Definitions developed in conjunction with the individual Councils. The Data Definitions are being enhanced to better help courts, counties, and vendors save time and money in the acquisition and implementation of court systems and to support data sharing initiatives.

The Data Definitions for each level of court are composed of two individual components, the *Court Process Flow* and *Court Data Dictionary*, that are linked by the underlying court documents. A Court Process Flow details the operational steps of the typical court for the given class of court. The Court Process Flows will help as courts setup or examine changes to their operation, support vendor discussions and RFP activities, and define data sharing initiatives.

The Data Definitions Artifacts created include Court Process Flows, Court Dictionary for each class of court, Common Data Dictionary and the Framework that documents a typical court's operations.

Data Definitions Usage Supports operational design and analysis of a court's processes, Supports deployment of court automated systems, Supports integrated justice / data sharing projects, Can be customized to meet local needs and is intended for use by State agencies/councils, counties, municipalities and vendors.

The Commission's newest member, State Court Judge T. Russell McClelland, III appointed October 26, 2006, has volunteered his own local county of Forsyth to serve as the beginning point for the test of the Data Definitions developed by the Commission. Forsyth County is looking into the purchase of a new case management system and is using the work products of the commission as crucial pieces in the compilation of their request for proposals package.

Since the development of the initial Data Definitions, an analysis has begun on the individual court Data Dictionaries to develop a Common Data Dictionary that contains data used across the classes of courts. The Common Data Dictionary will allow a court to maintain their court specific terminology associated with the data and provide a common language by which to talk about or exchange data with other courts or justice agencies.

The initial version of the Common Data dictionary will be available by summer and is being developed by Clerks and Judges from each Class of Court. This work is aligned with national standards and best practices like JIEM/NIEM and GJXDM. As a future initiative, the Commission plans the mapping the Common Data Dictionary to the GJXDM data sharing standard.

The Commission has begun a project to examine the Court Process Flow in the context of exchanges similar to the exchanges defined in the standard JIEM model. That activity is underway on a test basis with our Magistrate and Municipal courts. A project planned for the near future will include the remaining classes of court. This work will help with local data sharing initiatives, and when combined with the Common Data Dictionary will contribute to the reduction in implementation costs.

In addition to this work, the Commission is actively seeking feedback from vendors, counties, and other state agencies related to these Data Definitions and how they can be best enhanced to save time and money as court systems and data sharing initiatives are implemented.



The Georgia Committee on Access and Fairness in the Courts, a Supreme Court entity, serves as a vehicle for addressing the serious court-based issues of race, ethnic and gender bias: domestic violence; the need for interpreters and the physical access issues for persons with disability as well as other issues of bias, prejudice and discrimination. The Committee, chaired by Presiding Justice Carol Hunstein, currently has 23 members comprised of judges from various classes of court, attorneys, a law school professor, law students and a magistrate clerk.

During the 2006 reporting cycle, the Committee continued to work diligently to carry out the charge of the Supreme Court. Projects included American Sign Language (ASL) interpreters, physical and cognitive disabilities, Color of Justice Programs and trainings for judges and court personnel.

July of 2006 marked the start of several presentations throughout the year to various classes of courts on courthouse accessibility issues. The training proposals are a result of the accessibility handbook, *A Meaningful Opportunity to Participate*, and the need to educate courts on this relevant issue. Training was held for the Magistrate Court judges in Athens, Georgia, September 12, 2006. This training was followed by the State Court judges' training held October 10th; Probate Court judges/COAG training held on November 15th and the Superior Court judges' training on January 19, 2007. Training for the remainder of the year will include a module on sign language interpreters to educate judges and other court personnel on this growing trend.

A series of public hearings were conducted at the DeKalb County Public Library, the Latin American Association, Auburn Avenue Research Library and Savannah between September 2006 and March 31, 2007. Citizens and various members from area organizations attended the hearings and expressed their concerns regarding domestic violence issues in the courts; a shortage of sign language interpreters; and jury selection/participation by persons with disabilities.

On May 16 and 17, 2006, the Committee and the State ADA Coordinator's Office partnered with the Developmental Disabilities Coalition to host Georgia's first "Cognition Issues in the Courts" conference at the State Bar of Georgia. The discussion centered on state programs designed to navigate persons with cognitive disabilities in the court system. As a result of the conference findings, a White Paper was developed that the Committee will disseminate this year.

In 2006, the Committee purchased TTY/TDD equipment to provide access to Georgia courts for citizens with hearing impairments. The equipment is maintained at the Administrative Office of the Courts and the number is 404-463-6788.

In an effort to increase the number of qualified, experienced sign language interpreters, The District Court Administrators (DCA's) co-sponsored two trainings, the second of which will be held June 9-10, 2007 at the Administrative Office of the Courts' Atlanta training facility. Ms. Carla Mathers, a renowned attorney and certified legal trained sign language interpreter, will host the 12-hour training.

The Committee in conjunction with local sponsors hosted its first two *Color of Justice* Programs on November 4, 2006 and April 20, 2006, at the Georgia State University Law School and the Dougherty County Superior Court, respectively. The program, created by the Honorable Brenda Stith Loftin, National Association of Women Judges (NAWJ), encourages minority students in seventh through twelfth grades to consider the law and the judiciary as career goals. The program uses panel discussions and one-on-one settings for students to hear judges and lawyers share their personal and professional experiences regarding career preparation. Both programs were a success and the Committee is slated to host three additional programs this calendar year.

Most recently, the Committee embarked upon a strategic planning session to identify their vision, mission, current and future direction.

1. The continuation of racial, gender and economic disparate treatment in the courts, if not addressed, will result in:
2. A continuing lack of a functioning system for sign language interpreters and an increasing population of adult hearing impaired who are participants in the legal process, if not addressed, will result in:

4. The continued use of out dated court facilities and the failure to accommodate those with physical impairments, if not addressed, will result in:
5. The increase in the politicization of the courts, if not addressed, will result in:

6. A continued lack of knowledge in the judicial system, process and constitutional framework by the public, if not addressed, will result in:
7. The increasing technology availability and use (need to complete)

The Committee remains dedicated to ensuring all citizens receive fair and equal access to Georgia courts. With growing concern regarding juvenile justice, immigration and hearing impaired issues, the Committee will pursue training opportunities for court personnel in these areas.

In closing, as the new program manager, I look forward to the opportunity to serve the Committee and ensure the citizens of Georgia have equal access to the courts.

PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S REPORT TO JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF GEORGIA

(Prepared On May 11, 2007)

I am pleased to report on the progress of the mentoring component of the Transition Into Law Practice Program:

A. Evaluations By Inaugural Class of Beginning Lawyers and Mentors:

704 Beginning Lawyers and 729 Mentors constituted the inaugural class of the Transition Into Law Practice Program. This class of Beginning Lawyers consisted primarily of those who passed the July 2005 Bar Examination and who were admitted to practice after July 1, 2005. (The Program is mandatory for lawyers admitted after June 30, 2005, unless exempted. *State Bar Rule 8-104 (B)(1)*).

Both the Beginning Lawyers and the Mentors were given the opportunity to evaluate their respective experiences, and the responses were overwhelmingly positive. The response rate was 18%, a strong response rate according to Executive Director Cliff Brashier.

Of those responding, **97% of Mentors and 92% of Beginning Lawyers** reported that the Transition Into Law Practice Program substantially accomplished its goals.

The approval ratings were even higher when asked if they would recommend that the Mentoring component of the Transition Into Law Practice Program be continued. **98% of Mentors and 94% of Beginning Lawyers** recommended that the Program be continued for future Beginning Lawyers.

B. Current Class of Beginning Lawyers and Mentors:

1012 Beginning Lawyers are currently active in the Program. These Beginning Lawyers passed either the February 2006 Bar Examination or the July 2006 Bar Examination and were admitted to practice during 2006.

Three types of Mentoring are offered: Inside (Beginning Lawyer works in association with his or her Mentor); Outside (Beginning Lawyer is a sole practitioner and is paired one-on-one with his or her Mentor); or, Group Mentoring (Beginning Lawyer is either unemployed or employed in a non-legal setting). Currently, 72% of Beginning Lawyers are in Inside Mentoring; 9% of Beginning Lawyers are in Outside Mentoring and 19% of Beginning Lawyers are in Group Mentoring.

1218 Mentors are currently active in the Program. Our number of active Mentors continues to exceed our number of Beginning Lawyers.

Well over 100 Mentors attended our optional Mentor Orientation Program held in November of last year at the State Bar Center – an attendance increase of 100% over our first Mentor Orientation Program held in November of 2005.

C. Assistance With Mentor Recruitment For Sole Practitioners:

I wish to thank the following individuals and organizations for their assistance in locating Mentors for women and/or minority attorneys: Avarita Hanson, Executive Director of the Chief Justice's Commission on Professionalism; Tanya Jeffords of the Augusta Conference of African-American Attorneys; Thomas "Woody" Sampson of the Gate City Bar Association; Jennifer Keaton of the Georgia Association for Women Lawyers; and, Holly Geerdes of the YLD Minorities in the Profession Committee.

D. Webcast of Supreme Court of Georgia Oral Arguments:

Our Beginning Lawyers appreciate the willingness of our Supreme Court of Georgia to provide live webcasts of oral arguments on a regular basis. This practice allows Beginning Lawyers a convenient means of obtaining some of their Mandatory Advocacy Experiences.

Additionally, my office routinely provides notice of broadcasts, via email, to all Beginning Lawyers and their Mentors.

E. Program Status and Progress Reports:

Our Program continues to attract interest outside of Georgia. Bar leaders from 28 states and 2 foreign jurisdictions (Canada and Scotland) have contacted my office for information about our Program. 2 states (Ohio and South Carolina) have now implemented pilot mentoring programs

patterned after our Program. Our Program has been recently featured in publications of the South Carolina Bar and also the New Jersey Bar.

I presented a summary of our Program at a symposium sponsored by the Florida State Bar at Stetson University Law School in April, 2007. Following the presentation, the Florida State Bar Commission on Professionalism voted to form a task force to consider a pilot mentoring program. I have also been asked to participate in a symposium sponsored by the South Carolina Bar in the spring of 2008.

I present routine progress reports to the Standards of the Profession Committee, which oversees this Program. I also routinely present progress reports to: (1) the Commission On Continuing Lawyer Competency ("CCLC"); (2) the State Bar Board of Governors; (3) the Chief Justice's Commission on Professionalism; (4) the State Bar Committee on Professionalism; and, (5) Deans of Georgia's 5 Law Schools. Future progress reports will be made to the Magistrate Courts Training Council (June) and the Council of Superior Court Judges (July).

F. Summary

Our Program has been implemented and is running effectively and efficiently. My thanks to each of you for your continued assistance and support. Please feel free to contact me anytime with any questions about our Program.
