# Child Support Order is Modified in a Private Case and Includes a Private Income Deduction Order

A child support order may be modified by the court changing the current support amount, and the modified order may set an arrears amount and repayment on the arrears. When any of these things occur, it will be necessary for the court to enter a new, separate Income Deduction Order (IDO), signed by a judge and filed with the clerk of superior court.

See Uniform Superior Court Rule 24.11 for process information, and Uniform Superior Court Rule 24.12 requiring use of the IDO form made available on this website.

It is the responsibility of the custodial parent (CP) to furnish a copy of the modified child support order and IDO to the Family Support Registry (FSR), the employer/payor and the other party in the case. A CP may prepare the paperwork or hire an attorney to prepare the paperwork.

# **Forms and Processes**

## **Step 1 – Prepare and send these documents to the Family Support Registry:**

- 1. FSR Registration Form v1.2
- 2. A copy of the Income Deduction Order

Please include a copy of the modified <u>Child Support Order</u>. The FSR will update information from the registration form and order.

## Important!

Fax documents to 770-836-2701 *OR* mail documents to the Family Support Registry, P O Box 1800, Carrollton, GA 30112-1800. Georgia law requires all payments made by Income Deduction Order must be paid to the Family Support Registry. A record is made of each payment and the payment is sent to the CP.

### Step 2 – Prepare and send these documents to the employer/payor:

- 1. A copy of the new Income Deduction Order entered as part of the modification of child support.
- 2. Notice to Payor
- 3. Income Withholding Order (IWO) form (check the Amended IWO box)

# Important!

DO NOT have a judge sign the IWO or file the IWO with the superior court clerk's office! This form contains fields for the NCP/obligor's Social Security Number (SSN). Filing a document with the clerk that includes a Social Security Number violates Georgia law. The IWO is used as a NOTICE document in Georgia. The IDO signed by a judge is the only court order needed for this process.

### Step 3 – Prepare and send these documents to the Noncustodial Parent

- 1. A copy of the new Income Deduction Order entered as part of the modification of child support.
- 2. Statement of Rights, Remedies, and Duties
